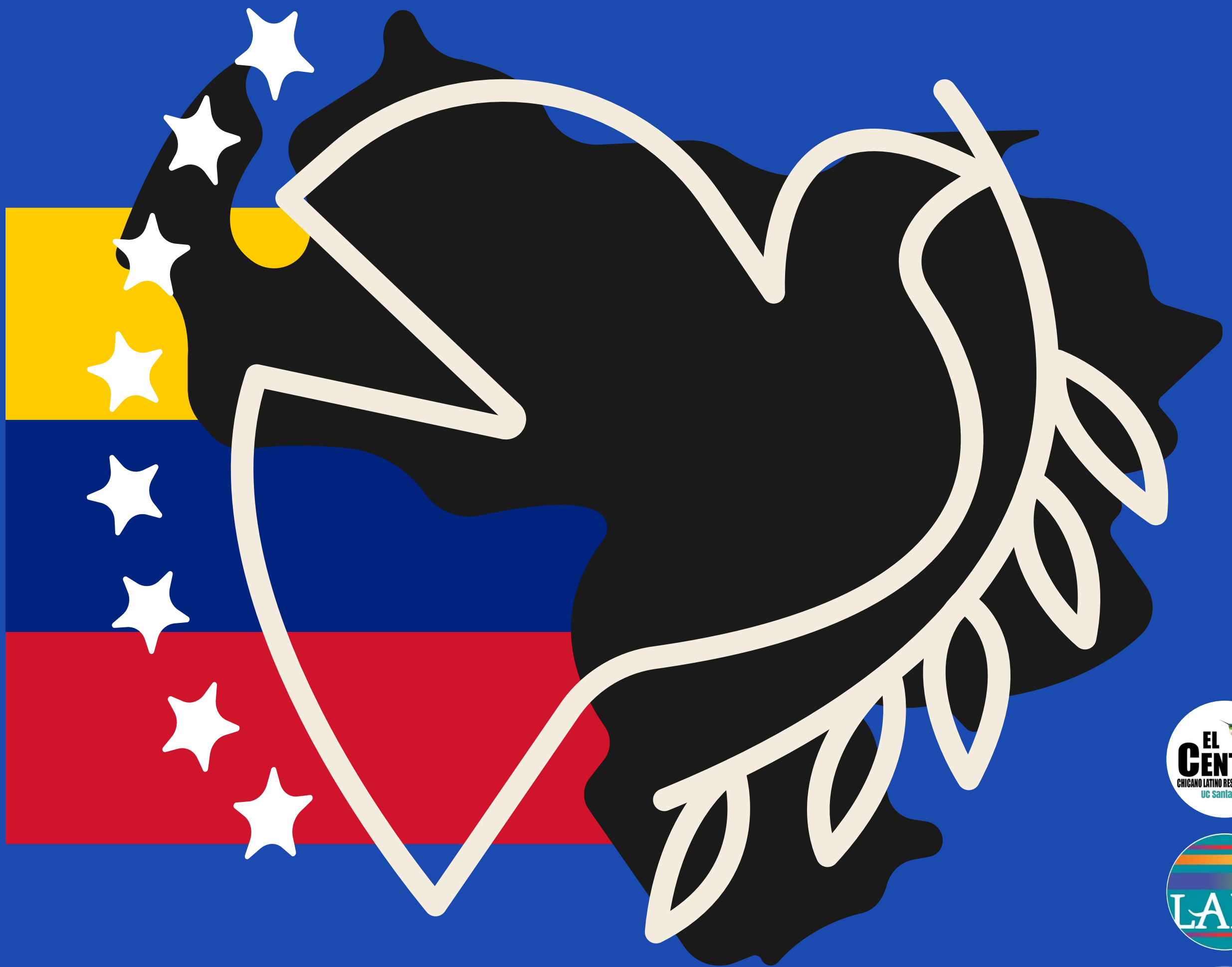

Carlos Martínez

Dr. Carlos Martinez received his PhD from the Joint Program in Medical Anthropology at UC San Francisco and UC Berkeley. He received his Master of Public Health degree from the Department of Public Health at San Francisco State

University. As an instructor, his primary goal is to support students in seeing themselves as holders and producers of knowledge as well as agents of change. As with his research, his teaching emphasizes the political and health inequalities structuring our society and ways that communities enact change.



Carolina Morales

Carolina Morales, MSW, is a violence prevention and immigrant rights advocate. She is a queer Latina who was born and raised in Venezuela, and has dedicated over 20 years to community wellness and racial justice advocacy through direct service provision, educational initiatives, and systems

change efforts with communities of color, immigrants, and formerly incarcerated people. She has worked in multiple sectors, from non-profit service provision, to public policy for county government offices, and philanthropy. Carolina designed and passed groundbreaking legislation that included establishing the first ombudsperson's office for sexual violence survivors in the country, and codifying cultural districts as municipally-funded, community development tools to address gentrification.
